Comments from the Chairwoman:

Honorable Harriet D. Cornell

As many of you know, I will not be chairing the Legislature in 2014. So tonight, which is the final meeting of 2013 I do want to take the opportunity to make a few brief comments.

I want to thank my colleagues, past and present, for giving me the honor to chair the Legislature and electing me each year for the past nine years. As the first Chairwoman and the longest serving Chair I am very grateful for the opportunity I have had to serve the people of Rockland County and promote causes that contribute to Rockland's quality of life. I will of course continue to serve on the Legislature.

My thanks to my fellow Legislators for all of your courtesies over the years, and certainly to our wonderful staff for its support and primarily for their unfailingly polite help given to the public that we all serve.

My thanks go also to County Executive Scott Vanderhoef and his staff for their help. I wish Scott well in the years ahead. I have spoken publicly about him and his service on several recent occasions.

As you know I am an unabashed supporter of County government, the services we provide, which are not duplicated by towns or village governments. I thank all the dedicated people who deliver these services, which includes the amazing not-for-profit agencies that we have in Rockland County who deliver everything from food for the body to food for the soul.

I am very proud of the initiatives I have started and accomplished. My colleagues will be happy I am not giving a thirty-minute speech, which I might have if I were reelected. I do want to touch on a few of the initiatives, which I think are worthy of mentioning. Rockland County was the first, and perhaps still, the only local government in the nation in the wake of 911 to form a Homeland Security Taskforce, which developed plans for both public and private sector protection. It is the only county in the nation to explore the ramifications of the *No Child Left Behind Act* on the children in the schools of our County. Rockland's report influenced the national dialog and the *No Child Left Behind Act* was not reauthorized. Working with STOP-FEAR, which I had earlier created with the Sheriff, DA, Family Shelter and VCS, we have safeguarded adults and children from violence and abuse and presently have an all-out effort to prevent sex-trafficking, which is known to occur during major events such as the upcoming Super Bowl. Initiating and then developing the *County Comprehensive Plan*, which was adopted by the Legislature to provide guidance to all levels of government in the decades ahead. The *Redistricting Plan* that was creating with public input and transparency in the short timeframe between release of census figures and the Legislative elections of 2011. Recognizing the demographic realities of an aging population growing at a rate that outpaces both state and national averages we developed the *Aging in Place Report* now a key part of the *County Comprehensive Plan*. There was also the creation of the Legislative Economic Committee, which sent a strong message to the business community about our serious support for economic development. The Tappan Zee Bridge summits I held ensured that the people had a say in the planning process and would not be caught by surprise by a Robert Moses style trestle going through their backyards. The Governor's Mass Transit Taskforce, which I called for along with a number of regional organizations and on which I served I have been an advocate for an improved west of Hudson Transit opportunities for our residents.

And working closely with Rockland's not-for-profit agencies, like Rockland 21-C, Childcare Resources of Rockland and Head Start, great strides have been made in ensuring that all children enter school ready to learn and to succeed.

Of course creating the Rockland County Health Facilities Corporation on time and with a full compliment of public-spirited individuals serving pro bona as board members.

So despite the financial downturn and the three years of striving for help from the State we still fulfilled the basic responsibilities of providing health, safety and welfare to the public. During the last nine years we have experienced some of the most difficult economic times in the County's history. We made difficult, painful choices and we are beginning to see the signs of improvement, but too many of our residents suffered the loss of jobs, the loss of services and even the loss of homes. As a Legislator I will continue to make their welfare one of my top priorities.

I will also continue to lead the fight to ensure the County has a safe sustainable water supply in the years to come. I personally oppose the costly desalinization plant proposed for the Hudson River. But regardless how one feels about the plant there is no question that we must develop a comprehensive water plan. I look forward to devoting my efforts to developing the taskforce and the plan I proposed to the Public Service Commission in October and I look forward to working with County Executive Ed Day on this issue, which he has endorsed. Thank you Ed for that.

I look forward to working with my fellow Legislators in the future to continue to ensure that decisions that impact our residents, particularly those residents most in need of our support, are made with equal measures of pragmatism and compassion. Thank you all for your patience in listening to me and for these years of support and courtesy.

**RESOLUTION NO. 663 OF 2013
AUTHORIZING THE TRANSFER OF ALL OF THE COUNTY'S RESIDUAL RIGHT,
TITLE AND INTEREST IN AND TO BUILDING A AT THE DR. ROBERT L. YEAGER
HEALTH CENTER TO ROCKLAND COUNTY HEALTH FACILITIES CORPORATION,
WITH RESERVATION OF RIGHTS
[OFFICE OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE]**

Mr. Grant offered the following resolution, which was seconded by Mr. Murphy and adopted:

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 192 of 2013 the Legislature of Rockland County authorized the formation and organization of the Rockland County Health Facilities Corporation (the "Corporation") pursuant to Section 1411 of Not-For-Profit Corporation Law of the State of New York (the "LDC Act"); and

WHEREAS, the LDC Act authorizes the legislative body of the County, by resolution, to determine that certain real property of the County not required for use by the County may be sold or leased to a not-for-profit local development corporation, lessening the burdens of government and acting in the public interest; and

WHEREAS, Section 1411(d) of the LDC Act further provides that the sale or lease may be on such terms as may be agreed upon by the County and the local development corporation, without appraisal or public bidding, provided the County first holds a public hearing on ten (10) days' notice; and

WHEREAS, in furtherance of the public purposes set forth the LDC Act, the County held a public hearing on ten (10) days' notice prior to the date of adoption of Resolution No. 192 of 2013 and by such resolution determined that the Facility is not required for use by the County and authorized the transfer to the Corporation of all of the County's right, title and interest in and to the Summit Park Nursing Care Center facility located at 50 Sanatorium Rd, Pomona, New York 10970, operated by the County under NYSDOH Certificate No. 4353000N as a 321 bed Residential Health Care Facility (the "Facility") by ninety-nine (99) year lease, with option to purchase all the real and personal property that is used or useful with respect to the operation of the Facility, reserving to the County the right to continue to operate the Facility under the County license until such time as the Corporation has given 60 days written notice to the County terminating the reserved rights ("Termination Date"), and subject further to the County's retention of all supplies and inventory with any remaining supplies and inventory at the time of the Termination Date being disposed of by the County to a future user of the Facility at market value; and

WHEREAS, the County Executive recommends and the Legislature of Rockland County desires to authorize the transfer to the Corporation of the remaining portions of the County's right, title and interest in and to Building A and related utility improvements that service solely Building A, all as located at 50 Sanatorium Rd, Pomona, New York 10970 to the extent not previously authorized to be transferred by Resolution No. 192 of 2013, as more accurately described in the attached description (the "Residual Building A Facilities"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to and in accordance with Section 1411(d) of the LDC Act, a public hearing relating to the proposed transfer of the Residual Building A Facilities was duly scheduled, noticed and conducted by the Legislature of Rockland County prior to the adoption of this resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Budget and Finance Committee of the Legislature has met, considered and approved this resolution; NOW THEREFORE BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Legislature of Rockland County, on behalf of the County, being an involved agency under the State Environmental Quality Review Act, has received a report from the Planning Department that they have reviewed the EAF in this matter and thereby found and determined that this resolution constitutes a Type II action and the Legislature accepts and adopts that action; and be it further

RESOLVED, that under the authority of the LDC Act with respect to the real property and under County Law Section 215 and Section 140-9.6 of the Rockland County Code with respect to the personal property, it being hereby determined that disposition of such personal property in this manner is in the best interest of the County, the County hereby determines that the Residual Building A Facilities are not required for use by the County and authorizes the transfer to the Corporation of all its right, title and interest in and to the Residual Building A Facilities by ninety-nine (99) year lease, with option to purchase all the real and personal property that is used or useful with respect to the operation of the Facility, reserving to the County the right to continue to operate the Residual Building A Facilities, until such time as the Corporation has given 60 days written notice to the County terminating the reserved rights (the "Residual Building A Facilities Termination Date"), and subject further to the County's retention of all supplies and inventory with any remaining supplies and inventory at the time of the Residual Building A Facilities Termination Date being disposed of by the County to a future user of the Residual Building A Facilities at market value, and subject further to the County's right to lease from such future user (i) those portions of the Residual Building A Facilities currently utilized by the County for its Departments of General Services – Facilities Management, Purchasing, MIS and Medical Examiner and for Laundry facilities, for an annual gross lease payment (inclusive of taxes, insurances, utilities and any common area charges or maintenance or capital costs) of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) per square foot per annum, payable monthly, subject to annual renewal at the election of the County for up to ten (10) years, and (ii) those portions of the Residual Building A Facilities currently utilized by the County for its Department of Hospitals on terms to be agreed upon between the County and such future user; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Legislature of Rockland County authorizes the County Executive to execute any and all documents, instruments and agreements or applications necessary or ancillary to the foregoing to effectuate the intent and purpose of this resolution, and shall document the reservation of rights in a lease agreement from the Corporation to the County that provides that the County shall pay all costs of the Corporation and shall pay all operational costs of the Residual Building A Facilities while a tenant, each of the foregoing being subject to the approval of the County Attorney.

Description of Residual Building A Facilities

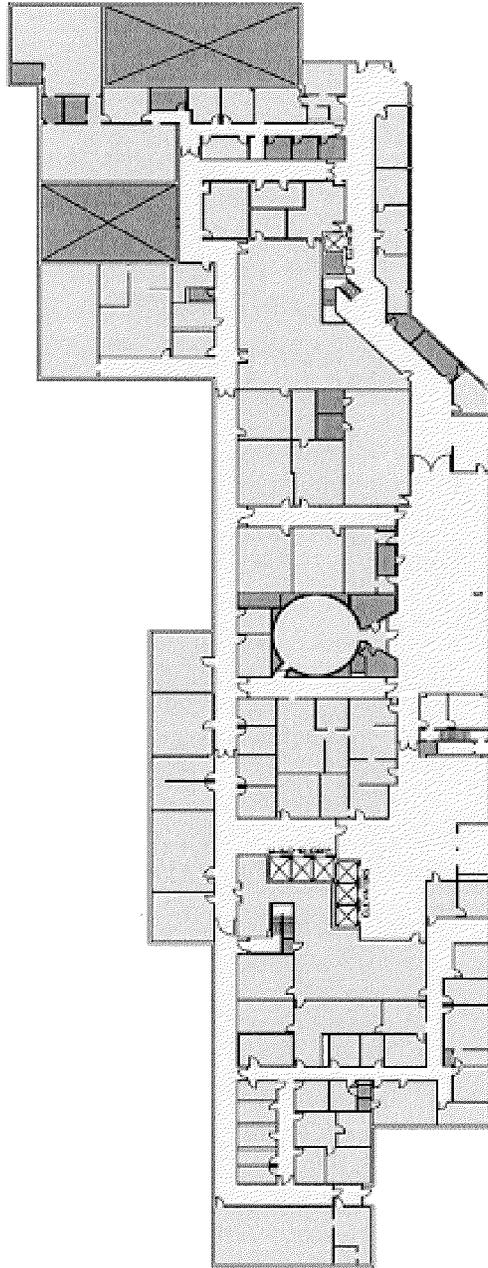
All right, title and interest to all real property, inclusive of fixtures and appurtenant rights, constituting the 1st, 2nd, 4th and 10th floors of "Building A" and that contiguous portion of Building E comprising the Laundry facilities, located at 50 Sanitorium Rd, Pomona, New York 10970, and owned and operated by the County of Rockland, including the roof, structural supports, exterior walls and windows and façade, entrance areas, utility closets, duct areas and ways and the elevator shafts and assets associated therewith which are subject to the easements described below (the "Residual Building A Facilities").

Together with easements in common with others for parking and pedestrian ingress and egress to the Residual Building A Facilities through lands and parking areas or associated lands or adjacent lands and facilities, owned by the County of Rockland within the Dr. Robert L. Yeager Health Center, from the currently existing points of access to public rights of way through said lands and buildings to the point of entry(ies) to the Residual Building A Facilities, for persons working at or visiting the Residual Building A Facilities and guests and invitees of the holder of the interests in the Residual Building A Facilities with the actual location of said easements to be determined based on existing uses subject to final review and approval by the County Executive and Chair of the Legislature.

Together with easements in common with others, including the County of Rockland, for sewer, water, gas, heating, ventilation, air conditioning, telephone, telecom, electric, sprinklers and related pumps and any other utilities, services or related equipment used or useful in the operation of the Residual Building A Facilities and other buildings and improvements within the Dr. Robert L. Yeager Health Center through lands, buildings and improvements and parking areas or associated lands or adjacent lands and facilities, owned by the County of Rockland within the Dr. Robert L. Yeager Health Center, and Building A, from the currently existing points of access through said lands and buildings to the point of entry(ies) to the Residual Building A Facilities, with the actual location of said easements to be determined based on existing uses subject to final review and approval by the County Executive and Chair of the Legislature.

The foregoing easements and rights shall be subject to: (i) reasonable rules and regulations for health and safety and use established from time to time by the County; (ii) any and all easements from Building A to other buildings and improvements within the Dr. Robert L. Yeager Health Center required by and benefiting the County of Rockland; and (iii) the holder of the interests in the Residual Building A Facilities agreeing to pay from time to time the commercially reasonable costs of operating and maintaining the utilities, parking areas and areas of ingress and egress, based on commercially reasonable cost allocations, which forgoing easements, the rights therein and thereto and the use thereof of Building A to be described in a Reciprocal Easement Agreement ("REA") benefiting and burdening Building A and the County of Rockland and until such time as such REA is approved by the County Executive and Chair of the Legislature, RCHFC may not assign the leasehold interest.

BUILDING A, FIRST (1st) FLOOR



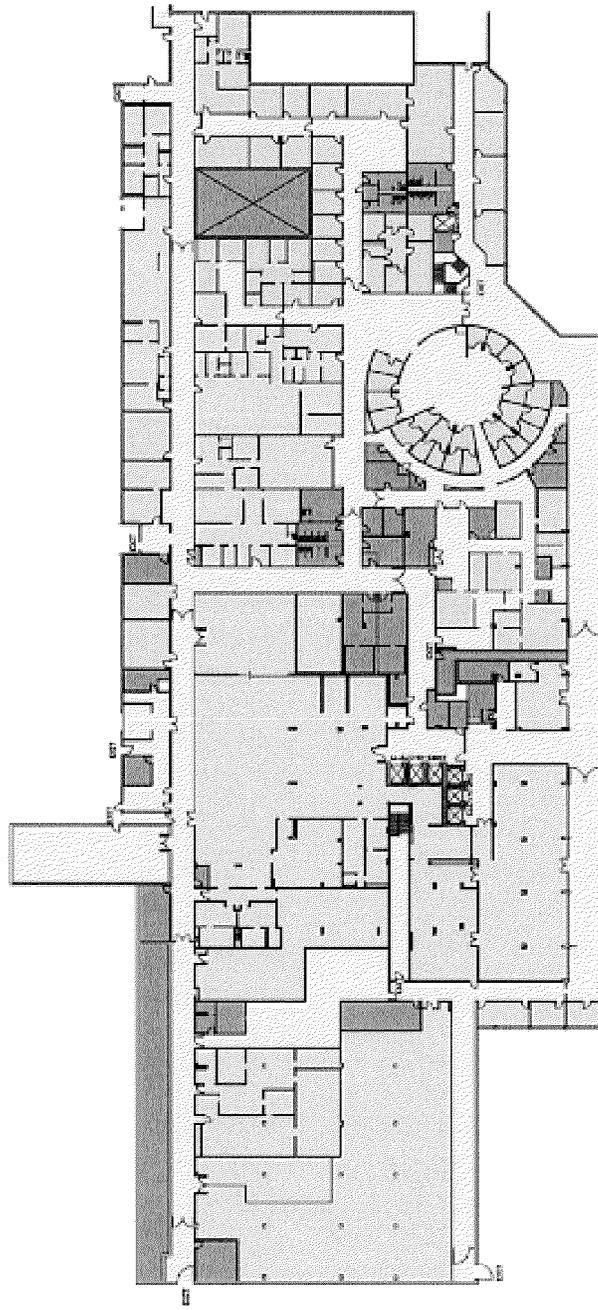

BUILDING A, FOURTH (4th) FLOOR

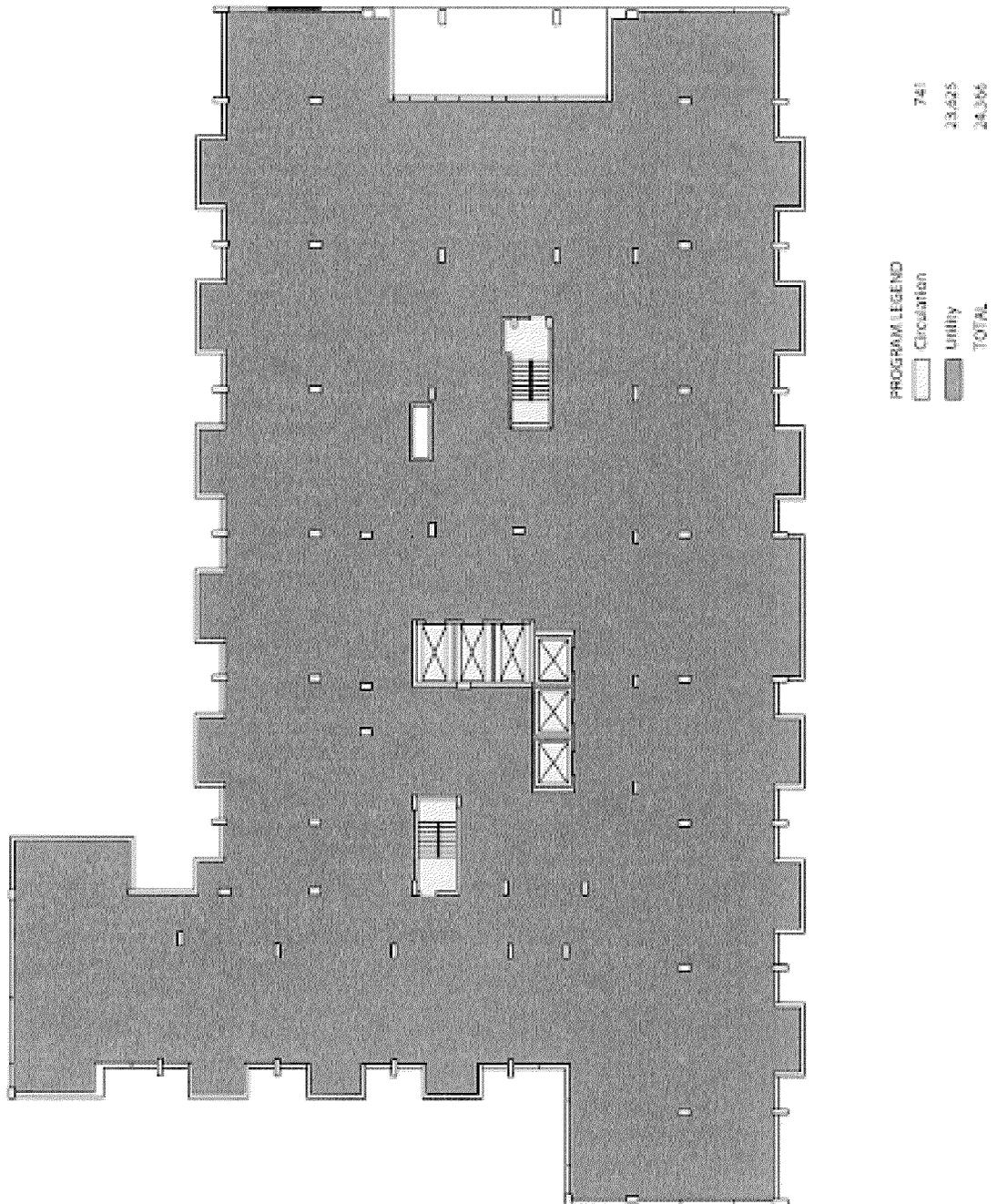

WHEREAS, By Resolution No. 32 of 2013, the Rockland County Solid Waste Management Authority set the Authority's rates, rentals, fees or other charges for the use or availability of its facilities and services for the year 2014 and approved the attached rates, rentals, fees or other charges for the use or availability of the Authority's facilities and services for the year 2014; and

WHEREAS, Under the terms of a Collection Agreement dated July 25, 1995, as amended, between the Authority and the County, the County assumes responsibility for the collection of the charges imposed by the Authority for the use or availability of the Authority's facilities and services from owners of real property within the County, and

Resolution No. 32 of 2013
ADOPTION OF RATES, RENTALS, FEES OR OTHER CHARGES FOR THE USE OR
AVAILABILITY OF THE FACILITIES AND SERVICES OF
THE AUTHORITY FOR THE YEAR 2014

WHEREAS, the Authority is a public benefit corporation, duly organized and existing under Title 13-M of the Public Authorities Law of the State of New York, as amended ("Public Authorities Law"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority is authorized under Section 2053-g of the Public Authorities Law to fix and collect rates, rentals, fees and other charges for the use or availability of the Authority's facilities and services; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the Authority to set its rates, rentals, fees or other charges for the use or availability of the Authority's facilities and services for the year 2014; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 2053-g of the Public Authorities Law, the Authority is required to hold a public hearing at which interested persons have had an opportunity to be heard concerning its rates, rentals, fees or other charges; and

WHEREAS, a duly noticed public hearing was held on October 24, 2013, for the purpose of setting the Authority's rates, rentals, fees or other charges for the use or availability of its facilities and services for the year 2014; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Authority Board hereby adopts the rates, rentals, fees or other charges for the use or availability of the Authority's facilities and services for the year 2014, annexed hereto and made a part of this Resolution as Exhibit "A"; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Executive Director is authorized to take all appropriate actions to effectuate the levying and collection of such rates, rentals, fees or other charges for the use or availability of the Rockland County Solid Waste Management Authority's facilities and services for the year 2014.

Grant: This sets the amount to be raised by the levy subsequently, the user charge at \$91.77. I sent an e-mail earlier in the week to all Authority members indicated my intention to make an adjustment to the host fee component of the expense side of the budget. If I were to be successful in moving that amendment through, it would reduce this \$91.77 charge down to \$59.53 a savings of \$32.24 directly to each and every user in the system. I think that is an admirable goal and I think everyone should have that information available to them. I'd like to make a motion to eliminate the host fees.

St. Lawrence: Let's make this an amendment to the budget which is next on the agenda.

Grant: Motion to make an amendment to eliminate the host fees. The proposed host fee goes from \$3M to \$3.4M this year. The total budget increases by about \$600,000 this year. So the increase in host fees is fully two-thirds of the increase in the total budget as it has been proposed here for the year. My amendment would eliminate the host fee and would reduce the user charge based on the schedule Ariene provided to us from \$91.77 to \$59.53 a net reduction of \$32.24 that would be to the benefit of every user in the Solid Waste Authority system.

St. Lawrence: Motion fails.

Stewart: What's the legitimacy of increasing the host fees or keeping it the same? They shouldn't go up and increase the taxes of the people of Rockland County.

Phillips: So you didn't mind increasing the taxes on the residents when you increased the rebate to you but you do mind increasing the taxes on the host benefit fee. It seems to me that you're contradicting yourself. So are you doing it because you don't want to increase the taxes or are you doing it because in one instance you feel it benefits you and in another instance it doesn't?

Stewart: I feel like in the case of the rebate, it is an incentive to recycle and it makes sense in terms with the mission of the Authority. In the case of the increase in the host fee, I don't see how that increases recycling. It is a substantial increase in the Authority's budget which is passed on to the taxpayers.

Grant: We all participate in the Public Authority's training and part of that training teaches us about ethics and related issues. In section 801 general municipal law speaks to conflicts of interest and it indicates that where there is a municipal law officer who has authority over contracts, auditing claims, etc. and engaged in both sides of the contract, they should abstain from the vote. It talks to not just officers of the municipality but officers and employees and perhaps council could weigh in on this, should abstain from the vote to avoid even the appearance of a conflict of interest because there is a benefit. I don't think we have a municipal agreement on the host fees.

Rea: I believe you cited a provision of the general municipal law. This doesn't apply to the Authority.

Grant: What conflicts of interest would apply? Clearly council there is a benefit to the towns and there are representatives of towns on this Authority. I'm not so sure they should be precluded from voting on everything. Certainly this is in the specific best interest of three members of the Authority and at least one employee who is also here tonight of a particular town that will benefit from it. I believe that is a conflict or at least raises to the level of an appearance of a conflict of interest. I personally think they should abstain.

St. Lawrence: Mr. Grant the members of the towns and the supervisors are appointed ex officio. They are performing their duties for the constituents they represent and for the county they represent and in the interest of the operations of the Authority to be able to have this intermunicipal agreement and the host sharing arrangement with the towns and the towns provide services to the Authority as well. That is why I don't think there is a conflict by any of the members of this Board
