LOCAL LAW NO.            OF 2016  
COUNTY OF ROCKLAND  
STATE OF NEW YORK

(Introduced by Hon. Nancy Low-Hogan)

A Local Law Prohibiting the Sale of Tobacco Products in Licensed Health Care Institutions, Pharmacies, Retail Establishments Containing Pharmacies and Educational Facilities in Rockland County, New York.

**Section 1. Name of local law**

This law shall be known as “the Tobacco-Free Pharmacies Act.”

**Section 2. Legislative Findings and Intent**

There exists conclusive evidence that tobacco smoke causes cancer, cardiovascular disease, respiratory disease, negative birth outcomes, allergies, and irritation to the eyes, nose, and throat; and whereas the majority of all smokers begin using tobacco products before age 18; an estimated three thousand (3,000) minors begin smoking every day in the United States; and the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services has concluded that nicotine is as addictive as cocaine or heroin; and despite state laws prohibiting the sale of tobacco products to minors, access by minors to tobacco products remains a major problem.

Each year over 13,000 New Yorkers are diagnosed with lung cancer and about 9,000 men and women in New York State die each year of this disease. Smoking is the most common cause of lung cancer and “second-hand smoke” increases the risk for lung cancer.

Nicotine has been found to affect cognition, particularly in adolescents, increase blood pressure, respiration and heart rate and has been observed to contribute to cardiovascular disorders including cardiomyopathy, peripheral vascular disease, atherosclerosis, hypertension, direct coronary spasm and ischemia, potentially leading to coronary artery disease and myocardial infarction.

In July of 2009, the Pharmacist Society of the State of New York (PSSNY), House of Delegates passed a resolution supporting efforts to end the sale of tobacco products in pharmacies.

The sale of tobacco products is inconsistent with the mission of Licensed Health Care Institutions because it is detrimental to public health and mitigates efforts to educate patients on the safe and effective use of medication.

The sale of tobacco products is inconsistent with the mission of Educational Institutions to educate young people about social, environmental and health risks and harms, and because youth are especially vulnerable to tobacco marketing which is a significant cause of youth smoking initiation.

Accordingly, in order to promote the health, safety and well-being of Rockland county residents, the purpose of this local law is to prohibit the sale of tobacco products in licensed health care institutions, educational institutions, pharmacies and retail establishments containing a pharmacy in Rockland County.

**Section 3. Definitions.**

As used in this Local Law, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

- A. **COUNTY** – the county of Rockland, New York.
- B. **TOBACCO PRODUCTS** shall mean any product in any form containing or derived from tobacco, including, but not limited to, cigarettes, chewing tobacco, snuff, dip, cigars, pipe tobacco, blunt wraps, and bidis; e-liquids, atomizers, cartomizers, clearomizers, tank systems, vials that contain e-liquids, vape pens, water pipes, nicotine gels, electric aerosol delivery systems, cigar clips, or any product comprised wholly or in part of tobacco that is manufactured as a wrap or a hollow tube designed to be filled by the consumer with loose tobacco or other fillers and then combusted and inhaled. “Tobacco Products” shall not include smoking cessation products, which includes drugs, devices, or combination products authorized for sale by the state or U.S. Food and Drug Administration, as those terms are define in the Federal Food, Drug and Cosmetics Act.
- C. **ELECTRONIC AEROSOL DELIVERY SYSTEM** shall mean an electronic device that, when activated, produces an aerosol that may be inhaled. Electronic Aerosol Delivery System includes any component part or accessory, and any liquid or other substance to be aerosolized, whether or not sold separately. Electronic Aerosol Delivery System does not include drugs, devices, or combination products authorized for sale by the state or U.S. Food and Drug Administration, as those terms are defined in the Federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Acts.
- D. **LICENSED HEALTH CARE INSTITUTION** shall mean any facility or institution engaged principally in providing services by or under the supervision of a physician or, in the case of a dental clinic or dental dispensary, of a dentist, for the prevention, diagnosis or treatment of human disease, pain, injury, deformity or physical condition, including, but not limited to, a general hospital, public health center, diagnostic center, treatment center, dental clinic, dental dispensary; or nursing home, residential health care facility, out-patient lodge, general hospital or any entity subject to licensing by the New York State Department of Health pursuant to New York Public Health Article 28.
- E. **PHARMACY** shall mean any place in which drugs and medical components are possessed for the purpose of preparing, compounding, preserving or dispensing of drugs, medicines and therapeutic devices on the basis of prescriptions and/or registered as a pharmacy pursuant to Section 6802 of New York Education law and are offered for sale at retail by advertising or otherwise. This includes facilities and retailers that maintain a pharmacy within their establishment
- F. **EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION** means any public or private college, normal school, professional school, scientific or technical institution, university or other institution furnishing a program of higher education.

G. **COMMISSIONER** shall mean the Rockland County Commissioner of Health.

H. **DEPARTMENT** shall mean the Rockland County Department of Health.

**Section 4. Restrictions on the sale of tobacco products.**

No Licensed Health Care Institution, Educational Institution, or Pharmacy located in Rockland County shall sell or cause to be sold tobacco products.

**Section 5. Enforcement and Penalties.**

- A. The Commissioner shall have sole jurisdiction to enforce the provisions of this local law.
- B. If the Commissioner determines after notice and hearing that a violation of section 4 of this local law has occurred, the Commissioner may impose a civil penalty in the amount of \$500 for a first violation, and \$1,000 for each subsequent violation. Nothing herein shall be construed to prohibit the Commissioner from commencing a proceeding for injunctive relief to compel compliance with this local law.
- C. Hearings held pursuant to the authority of this local law shall be conducted in accordance with the procedures set forth in the Rockland County Sanitary Code by the Commissioner or his or her designee.
- D. The decision of the Commissioner shall be reviewable pursuant to Article 78 of the New York Civil Practice Law and Rules.
- E. The Rockland County Attorney may bring an action in the name of Rockland County or the Rockland County Commissioner of Health to recover the civil penalty provided by this local law in any court of competent jurisdiction.

**Section 6. Severability.**

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part of this law or the application thereof to any person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, or business shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part of this law, or in its specific application to the person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity or circumstance directly involved in the controversy in which such order or judgment shall be rendered..

**Section 7. Applicability.**

This law shall apply to any and all actions occurring on or after the effective date of this law.

**Section 8. Effective Date.**

This law shall take effect within 60 days from the filing in the Office of the Secretary of State.
