**AND AUTHORIZING THE ROCKLAND COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING**  
**TO APPLY TO THE TOWN OF CLARKSTOWN FOR A SPECIAL USE PERMIT**

WHEREAS, By Resolution No. 341 of 2016, the Legislature of Rockland County authorized and directed the Clerk to the Legislature to advertise for bids for the sale of County owned real property located at 18 New Hempstead Road, New City, New York, by public advertisement in accordance with County Law §215; and

WHEREAS, The Clerk to the Legislature advertised for public sale the County owned real property located at 18 New Hempstead Road, New City, New York in accordance with County Law §215 and solicited sealed bids under RFB-RCLEG-2016-001 (the "RFB"); and

WHEREAS, On September 15, 2016, one (1) bid was received for the purchase of the county owned property from ND Acquisitions, LLC, 2310 Washington Street, Newton Lower Falls, MA 02462, and was publicly opened; and

WHEREAS, The County Attorney found the bid to be "no-responsive and invalid because: 1) the bidder, in violation of the bid terms, failed to include a check for certified funds equal to 10% of its bid; and 2) The bidder rejected the terms of sale included in the RFB and offered different terms of purchase, which materially and substantially varied from the term set forth in the RFB" and opined that the Legislature cannot accept the bid as a matter of law; and

WHEREAS, The Legislature believes that if the County applied to the Town of Clarkstown for a special use permit that would allow the property to be developed into senior citizen housing - as already supported by elected officials both in Town and County government - the County could then issue a new RFB for property with enhanced value, thereby facilitating additional and higher bids; and

WHEREAS, The \_\_\_\_\_ Committee of the Legislature has met, considered and \_\_\_\_\_ approved this resolution; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Rockland County Legislature hereby rejects the bid received from ND Acquisitions, LLC and publicly opened on September 15, 2016 for the purchase of the parcel located at 18 New Hempstead Road, New City, New York under RFB-RCLEG-2016-001; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Rockland County Department of Planning shall apply to the Town of Clarkstown for a special use permit that would allow the property to be developed into senior citizen housing as already supported by elected officials both in Town and county government.

WHEREAS, Pursuant to New York Social Services Law §.365-a(2)(e) and Title 18 of the New York Code, Rules and Regulations (NYCRR), the Commissioner of Social Services is required to administer personal care services to persons eligible to receive such services; and

WHEREAS, The Commissioner also is required by law to administer the Medicaid program including, when appropriate, approving home care services; and

WHEREAS, The Commissioner of Social Services issued a Request for Information (RFI) for personal care services for the period from July 1, 2016 through December 31, 2020 under RFI-RC-2016-001 (the "RFI"); and

WHEREAS, The Commissioner of Social Services awarded the RFI to the seventeen (17) agencies listed on the annexed Schedule A, which are licensed to provide personal care services; and

WHEREAS, The choice of provider rests with the recipient; and

WHEREAS, The agreements may be in excess of \$100,000; and

WHEREAS, Payment is made under the Medicaid program directly by New York State; and

WHEREAS, The County's required contribution to the Medicaid program is capped by law, and any remaining balance will be paid by the State; and

WHEREAS, The Commissioner of the Department of Social Services therefore recommends to the County Executive and the Legislature of Rockland County that the

County enter into agreements, which may be in excess of \$100,000, with the seventeen (17) licensed personal care agencies listed on the annexed Schedule A to provide personal care services under the RFI for the period from July 1, 2016 through December 31, 2020; and

WHEREAS, Sufficient funding for these agreements exists in the 2016 Budget of the Department of Social Services and is contingent upon 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020 Budget appropriations; and

WHEREAS, Local Law No. 18 of 1996 provides for the Legislature to approve the "execution of all contracts in excess of \$100,000 entered into by the County"; and

WHEREAS, The Committees of the Legislature have met, considered and approved this resolution; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Legislature of Rockland County hereby approves the agreements, which may be in excess of \$100,000, with the seventeen (17) licensed personal care agencies listed on the annexed Schedule A to provide personal care services under RFI-RC-2016-001 for the period from July 1, 2016 through December 31, 2020, and hereby authorizes the County Executive to execute the agreements, subject to the approval of the County Attorney; and be it further

RESOLVED, That sufficient funding for these agreements exists in the 2016 Budget of the Department of Social Services and is contingent upon 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020 Budget appropriations.
