<p>GOALS & OBJECTIVES:</p>	<p>The Rockland County Department of Health seeks to reduce death and disability due to chronic disease by initiating targeted lifestyle interventions in the Rockland County Community through the Creating Healthy Places to Live, Work and Play initiative funded by the New York State Department of Health.</p> <p>Village of Spring Valley is committed to working with the Rockland County Department of Health to implement policy and environmental improvements in the following areas to reach the goals of a healthier community: Create, rehabilitate, maintain and promote parks and recreation facilities in underserved residential areas to offer safe, accessible and attractive opportunities for physical activity for persons of all ages and abilities. Develop and/or enhance playgrounds for children that are safe, attractive, accessible and available; Develop transportation policies and environmental changes to ensure streets are safe, accessible and convenient for all users of the roadway including: pedestrians, bicyclists, users of public transit, motorists, children, the elderly, and people with disabilities.
