**Item:** *DAVID & CLAUDIA GOLLUB (O-690F)*

Variances to permit an addition to an existing residence, and construction of a new accessory storage shed, new covered porch, and patio, and relocation of the driveway. Required variances include: side yard, total side yard, rear yard, and maximum floor area ratio. The parcel is located on .38 acres in the R-15 zoning district.

South side of the terminus for Elmer Street, east side of the Palisades Interstate Parkway

### Reason for Referral:

Palisades Interstate Parkway

The County of Rockland Department of Planning has reviewed the above item. Acting under the terms of the above GML powers and those vested by the County of Rockland Charter, I, the Commissioner of Planning, hereby:

### *\*Recommend the following modifications*

- 1 It is normally our policy to request than an undisturbed, vegetated 20-foot buffer area be maintained along the property line adjacent to the Palisades Interstate Parkway. The intent of this buffer is to not only protect the visual integrity of the Parkway, but to preserve the existing vegetation and root systems from damage due to adjacent construction/on-site activities. This area must be clearly delineated on the map, and on the deed so that future property owners are aware of this restriction, and all structures kept out of this buffer area.
- 2 A review must be completed by the Palisades Interstate Park Commission and any comments or concerns addressed.
- 3 As indicated in the October 15, 2018 letter from the Rockland County Department of Health, if a stormwater management system is required, a review must be done by them to ensure compliance with the County's Mosquito Code.

4 This neighborhood is characterized by similar lot sizes and residential structures. The applicant has slightly decreased the size of the addition, but is still seeking a floor area ratio that is 57.5% greater than permitted. Granting a variance of this magnitude may set a precedent for other property owners within close proximity to also request similar variances, and thereby change the character of the neighborhood. The Town of Orangetown should evaluate this proposal in context to the surrounding community, and the precedent that could be set.
