Performance standards for the replacement of a 200KW generator with a 600KW emergency standby generator on the first floor of a building located on 1.58 acres in the CC zoning district.

Reason for Referral:



The County of Rockland Department of Planning has reviewed the above item. Acting under the terms of the above GML powers and those vested by the County of Rockland Charter, I, the Commissioner of Planning, hereby:

****Recommend the following modifications***

- 1 The applicant must obtain any necessary permits from the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation's Division of Air Resources for the proposed generator.
- 2 The applicant must provide as-built drawings and other documentation to New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, Region 3, that illustrate the design and installation of the petroleum bulk storage tanks for the proposed generators, as per code. These tanks must also be registered with them.
- 3 A review must be completed by the County of Rockland Department of Highways, any concerns addressed, and any required permits obtained.
- 4 A review must be completed by the County of Rockland Department of Health, any comment or concerns addressed, and any required permits obtained.

**NYS General Municipal Law Section 239 requires a vote of a 'majority plus one' of your agency to act contrary to the above findings.*

The review undertaken by the Rockland County Planning Department is pursuant to, and follows the mandates of Article 12-B of the New York General Municipal Law. Under Article 12-B the County of Rockland does not render opinions, nor does it make determinations, whether the item reviewed implicates the Religious Land Use and Institutionalized Persons Act. The Rockland County Planning Department defers to the municipality forwarding the item reviewed to render such opinions and make such determinations if appropriate under the circumstances.

In this respect, municipalities are advised that under the Religious Land Use and Institutionalized Persons Act, the preemptive force of any provision of the Act may be avoided (1) by changing a policy or practice that may result in a substantial burden on religious exercise, (2) by retaining a policy or practice and exempting the substantially burdened religious exercise, (3) by providing exemptions from a policy or practice for applications that substantially burden religious exercise, or (4) by any other means that eliminates the substantial burden.

Proponents of projects are advised to apply for variances, special permits or exceptions, hardship approval or other relief.

Pursuant to New York State General Municipal Law §239-m(6), the referring body shall file a report of final action it has taken with the Rockland County Department of Planning within thirty (30) days after final action. A referring body which acts contrary to a recommendation of modification or disapproval of a proposed action shall set forth the reasons for the contrary action in such report.
