Item: *DR. NEEMA NARANG (SP-825)*

Site plan for the first floor apartments to be moved to the second floor, and the dental office to be moved from the second floor to the first floor, for an existing building located on .59 acres in the BU zoning district.

West side of US Routes 9W/202, approximately 35 feet south of Smith Street

Reason for Referral:

US Routes 9W/202, Main Street (CR 108)

The County of Rockland Department of Planning has reviewed the above item. Acting under the terms of the above GML powers and those vested by the County of Rockland Charter, I, the Commissioner of Planning, hereby:

****Recommend the following modifications***

- 1 A review shall be completed by the New York State Department of Transportation, any concerns addressed, and any required permits obtained.
- 2 A parking calculation must be supplied that includes both the required and provided number of parking spaces. This will ensure that sufficient parking is available on site, particularly since the site is located on a State highway.
- 3 The handicapped parking space appears to be the same size as the standard parking spaces. Either the parking space should be increased to be 11 feet wide, or eight feet wide with a five-foot wide aisle space.
- 4 A review must be completed by the County of Rockland Department of Highways and any concerns addressed and required permits obtained.

5 All proposed signage shall be indicated on the site plan, properly set back from the State highway, and shall conform to the municipality's sign standards.

**NYS General Municipal Law Section 239 requires a vote of a 'majority plus one' of your agency to act contrary to the above findings.*

The review undertaken by the Rockland County Planning Department is pursuant to, and follows the mandates of Article 12-B of the New York General Municipal Law. Under Article 12-B the County of Rockland does not render opinions, nor does it make determinations, whether the item reviewed implicates the Religious Land Use and Institutionalized Persons Act. The Rockland County Planning Department defers to the municipality forwarding the item reviewed to render such opinions and make such determinations if appropriate under the circumstances.

In this respect, municipalities are advised that under the Religious Land Use and Institutionalized Persons Act, the preemptive force of any provision of the Act may be avoided (1) by changing a policy or practice that may result in a substantial burden on religious exercise, (2) by retaining a policy or practice and exempting the substantially burdened religious exercise, (3) by providing exemptions from a policy or practice for applications that substantially burden religious exercise, or (4) by any other means that eliminates the substantial burden.

Proponents of projects are advised to apply for variances, special permits or exceptions, hardship approval or other relief.

Pursuant to New York State General Municipal Law §239-m(6), the referring body shall file a report of final action it has taken with the Rockland County Department of Planning within thirty (30) days after final action. A referring body which acts contrary to a recommendation of modification or disapproval of a proposed action shall set forth the reasons for the contrary action in such report.
