**Item:** *WIDEWATER (UN-76C)*

Variations to allow the proposed construction of an inground pool, pool house, and sea wall for a dwelling currently under construction. The parcel is located in the R-2 zoning district on 3.43 acres. Required variations include greater than permitted maximum coverage of the lot and 625 sq. ft. additional disturbance of area with slope greater than 40%.

East side of North Broadway, approximately 215 feet south of Lexow Avenue

**Reason for Referral:**

Town of Clarkstown (at the Hudson River)

The County of Rockland Department of Planning has reviewed the above item. Acting under the terms of the above GML powers and those vested by the County of Rockland Charter, I, the Commissioner of Planning, hereby:

***\*Recommend the following modifications***

- 1 An updated review shall be completed by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, and any required permits obtained.
- 2 An updated review must be completed by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, and all required permits obtained.
- 3 An updated review must be completed by the New York State Department of State, Division of Coastal Zone management, and all required permits obtained.
- 4 The Floodplain Administrator for the Village of Upper Nyack shall certify that the proposed construction is in compliance with the floodplain regulations of the Village and the Federal Emergency Management Agency.
- 5 To help reduce the degree of lot coverage, pervious pavers/pavement must be used wherever possible, such as in the driveway areas.
